## OTHER REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL ENTRY:

<u>Physical Exam</u>: The requirements for physical examination of students pursuant to 105 CMR 200.100 (B) should be continued to be followed. An in-person physical exam is required for the following groups of students:

- For students entering school for the first time (typically pre-kindergarten or kindergarten), an inperson physical exam should be conducted one year before or within 90 days of school start.
- A student transferring from another school system shall be examined following the school entry recommendation for students entering school for the first time, listed above.

<u>Lead Screening</u>: The Department of Public Health requires that all children be screened for lead paint poisoning *prior* to entering kindergarten. This regulation became effective in 1989. The lead paint screening is a simple procedure that can be performed in the pediatrician's office at the time of a regular visit.

\*\*Please be sure to have this test completed prior to your child entering Kindergarten and have documented proof on the physical exam form OR a copy of the lab results. \*\*

<u>Pre-Kindergarten Vision Screening</u>: In accordance with State Law, all incoming kindergarten students must present certification that the student has completed a vision screening within the previous 12 months or within 30 days after school entry.
